**CHALLENGE**

The Principal of Cesar Chavez Community School in Phoenix, AZ had a dilemma; the school couldn't find a qualified Math teacher in the Roosevelt Elementary School District area. They were able to find a substitute teacher, but the sub had no Math background, so the students were not able to achieve positive academic outcomes.

The Principal had two goals:

1. Find a high quality instructor to fill the vacancy
2. Ensure students achieve positive academic outcomes

**GOALS**

Ms. Smith had two goals in mind to solve the Math teacher vacancy: 1) find a high quality instructor to fill the vacancy and 2) ensure that the students achieve positive academic outcomes as a result of this new instructor. Various schools in the Roosevelt Elementary School District were already partnering with Elevate K-12 for their Tier 2 small group intervention needs, and the school staff was extremely impressed with the program's high quality instruction, engaging content, and positive academic outcomes. The district approached Elevate K-12 for their Tier 1 needs to see if they could provide similar high quality core classroom instruction.
